To take the German ZfA (Zentralstelle für Auslandsschulwesen) exams called "Deutsches Sprachdiplom" (DSD) which fulfills the language requirements for students of foreign countries to study at German colleges and universities. These exams are at levels I and II in March 2010¹.

SBDS prepares and guides students for the German AP test and the DSD exams right here in the San Francisco South Bay area.
