Classes

For beginners and native speakers of all ages.

Saturdays from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon during the school year (except Holidays).

The maximum class size is 20 students.

Students are assessed on their first day of school and placed into the class best representing their proficiency.

Toddlers to Teenagers

We offer many levels including toddlers (with parents), pre-school, kindergarten through 8th grade and college test preparations for teenagers.



The toddler/pre-school/kindergarten groups focus on learning German through rhymes, games, play and other activities suited for the age of the students. They sing songs, listen to stories, work on arts and crafts projects and occasionally play traditional German games.

The higher grades use contemporary books and materials carefully selected by the teachers. Students will emphasize conversation and grammar and are involved in performances and other participatory activities. Simple homework during the week reinforces the education.

Adults

There are several adult classes from beginners to conversational.



The students usually work with text books that allow self studies to advance quickly. The teachers focus on and help with German pronunciation and introduce diverse German accents, speech patterns and idiomatic expressions.

Tests and Diplomas

Starting in the 4th Grade, students may participate in AATG tests of levels 2, 3 and 4 (American Association of Teachers of German).

A special course prepares students for the German Advanced Placement (AP) test of the College Board to earn valuable US college credits.

We also administer the DSD (Deutsches Sprach Diplom) exams that gives the students the language certification for German colleges and universities.
