To take the exams offered by the German ZfA (Zentralstelle für Auslands-schulwesen) called "Deutsche Sprachdiplom" (DSD) which enables students of foreign countries to study at German colleges and universities. These exams are at different levels A2, B1 and C1 in March 2009¹.
